Amruteshwar Arts, Commerce and Science College, Vinzar was established in the year **August 1997** with noble motto “**Sarva Shreshtha Dan Vidya Dan**” i.e. ‘Imparting education is the best donation’. This motto is being fulfilled by imparting the higher education to the students of Velha Tehsil, the most backward and remote tehsil in Pune district. Since 1997, 18 batches have been graduated from our college. Past students are now serving in various private/public sector organizations and companies. Some of them have pursued for higher studies in various disciplines. The college has fully qualified competent teaching faculty. They are not only engaging the classroom teaching but also they are on the forefront of social, cultural and extension activities of the college.

Our mission is to provide higher education to students in rural and remote area like Velhe tehsil. Establishment of this college has brought metamorphosis in the lives of students in hilly and remote area. Before establishment of this college in August 1997, seeking higher education was very time and money consuming process for the students and specially dream far away from reach for girls students. The level of literacy was very low due to inaccessibility of higher educational facilities. Establishment of this college has contributed a lot in development of percentage of higher education. Girls got avenue to complete their education which was otherwise very difficult. So as the rate of higher education increased, the doors of the world opened for them. Many students admitted for PG in their respective subjects, many opted for B.Ed, B.PEd, B.Lib

courses. Many students became computer literate. Samaj Shikshan Mandal, Vinzar and Amruteshwar Arts, Commerce & Science College is committed for continuous upliftment and progress of the unprivileged and underprivileged students.

By understanding the fact that college is operating in one of the most backward thesis of the state Maharashtra, upliftment of the village people, inculcating learning habits and spreading the light of education up to the last family of the village is deeply convinced idea of the institution.

We have succeeded in creating educational awareness especially the importance of higher education of girls among the residents of Velha Tehsil. As a result Number of girl students is continuously increasing. We work for overall development of them and provide all possible support for their growth. Various scholarships and free-ships are made available to needy students. They are financially supported. Consciousness towards social responsibilities is raised through NSS Regular and Special Camping activities and other extension activities. We motivate our girl student to participate in it.

Girl students are given a chance to develop their personality through participating in various social, cultural, sports competitions etc. which are organized by different institutions and colleges. Our organizers take care of providing them a healthy environment so that girls can participate in any such activity. As a result almost all our girl student participate in various excursion tours, science exhibitions, seminars and various quiz competitions in and outside the college. Many of our girl students are enthusiastically participating in spots like reselling, jumping and archery.

We also motivate girl students to continue their higher education even after they leave our college. Our faculty members often provide counseling to their parents in this regard. This has a fruitful outcome, as many of have our girl students have pursued for M.Sc. in Microbiology, Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics in reputed colleges in Pune.

Anti-ragging Committee and Internal Complaints Committee are formed in the college. These committees arrange lectures of lawyers, social workers to aware the girls for their privileges and duties.

I. Gender

Gender is a socially constructed definition of women and men. It is not the same as sex (biological characteristics of women and men) and it is not the same as women. Gender is determined by the conception of tasks, functions and roles attributed to women and men in society and in public and private life

II. Concept of Gender Audit

The Gender Audit is an attempt to study whether the college has good gender balance. It tries to see whether college follows government rules, policies and actions formulated for up-gradation of women in society. The Gender Audit tries to assess the impact of its current and proposed policies on gender equality.

A gender audit is a tool to assess and check the institutionalization of gender equality into organizations, including in their policies, programmes, projects and/or provision of services, structures, proceedings and budgets.

Gender audits establish a baseline against which progress can be measured over time, identifying critical gender gaps and challenges, and making recommendations of how they can be addressed through improvements and innovations.

III. Objectives of Gender Audit

- To find out the areas of gender imbalance and the factors behind the gender imbalance. To suggest measures for bridging the gender gap.
- To establish good gender balance in decision-making processes in all areas of the college activities.
- To cultivate gender equality in all aspects of college community.
- To see the work and capacity for prevention of sexual harassment at the college
- To survey the facilities available for females in the institute and look for the updating in it if require.

6. Gender Sensitive Features of the College

Gender sensitive features are carefully observed in every corner of the college system. By forming various committees like Anti-ragging, Internal Complaints, and Sexual Harassment Prevention, and providing adequate facilities to both girls and boys, gender equality is kept upright in the college.

Facilities provided to the Students:

Amruteshwar Arts, Commerce and Science College, Vinzar, which is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University is run by Samaj Shikshan madal for the

students in rural areas of velhe tehsil. This organization is purely govern by the villagers of vinzar village. We do not get any funds from the university or the government except the salary grants. The college building is built up by the funds raised by the villagers. As we have extended with science faculty, current building is becoming inadequate in last few years. Samaj shikskan madal is planning for new building and rigorously working on the implementation. Apart from this we provide the following facilities for overall growth of the students.

1. Experienced Teachers:

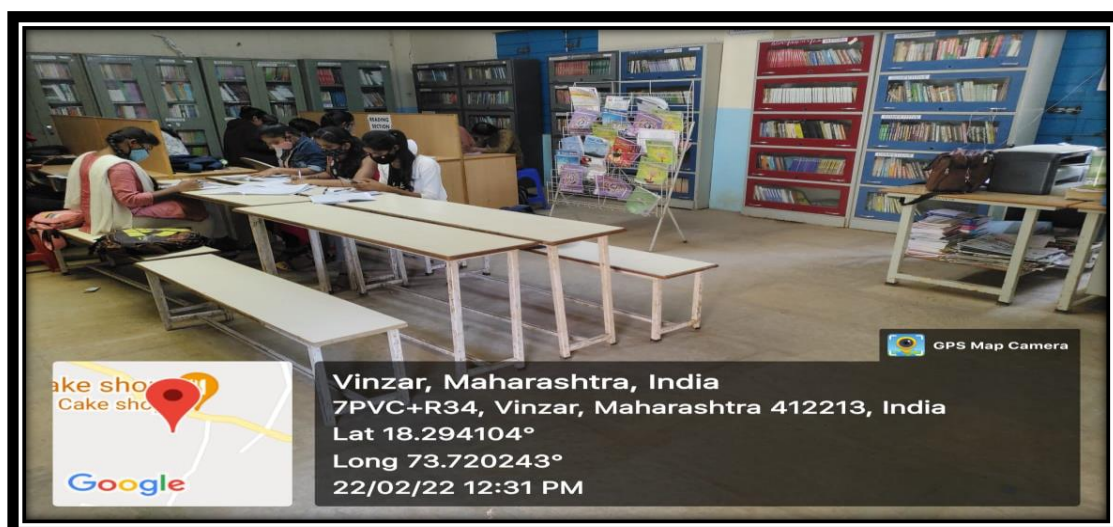
Highly qualified and well experienced teachers are there for each subject. They are efficient in solving academic problems of students. The total number of teachers is 20. Out of which 16 are male and four are females. Hundred percent female staffs are awarded with Ph.D. Degree. 81 percent of male teachers are also awarded with Ph.D. degree.

2. Free Transport Facility for the girls' students:

Velhe tehsil is remote and hilly area of the Pune district. Catchment area of our students is widely spread within the tehsil. Many villages are far from the main road and not having public transport to reach the main road. So the students can reach main road only by walk of at least 4-5 km. Thus there is an issue of safety and distance of the girl students. So college provides completely free transport facility to the girls on some of these routes.

3. Library and Reading Room:

Library is the soul of every educational institute. The library has a wide range of text books/ reference books/ e-literature in each subject. It is an updated library and every year the books are updated according to the syllabus provided by the staff. Library has plenty of books useful for competitive exam and carrier guidance. Our library is reach with reference books and textbooks. Reading space to the students is available in the library. Daily newspapers are available to students for reading. Library also provides identity cards for both students and the teachers.

4. Audio Visual Classroom: To circulate the latest knowledge among students, college has started audio visual classroom with internet, LCD projector and computer etc. Students can take benefit of these facilities.

5. Ladies Room: Provision is made for girls to rest in Ladies Room. Room has to be enlarged as the number of girl students regularly attaining the college is much more.

6. Washroom Facility: At four different places girls and boys washrooms are situated in the college with ample supply of water and regular cleaning. It is supplemented with a separate facility for the staff.

7. Drinking Water: Drinking water facility is available for the students and staff. Water purifier is installed in college premises.

8. Ramp: Keeping in mind the needs of physically handicapped students, ramps have been provided at the entrance to ease accessibility.

9. Suggestion Box: Suggestion box have been provided to inculcate student feedback in college administration.

10. CCTV: CCTV cameras have been installed in appropriate places to look after the security aspect as well as management of the college. These have been installed in corridors, library, reading room, office, staff room, Principal cabin and exam department.

11. Notice Boards: Notice boards are available in both the wings of the college and also at the entrance.

12. Sports facilities: College takes special efforts to promote sports among the students. Indoor games in the college are weight lifting, power lifting, Wrestling, Boxing and archery. Outdoor games are Kabbadi, Kho-Kho, Ball Badminton and volleyball. Physical education department runs various programmes for the students and organize various university and district level competitions. Yoga awareness programmes are also organized frequently

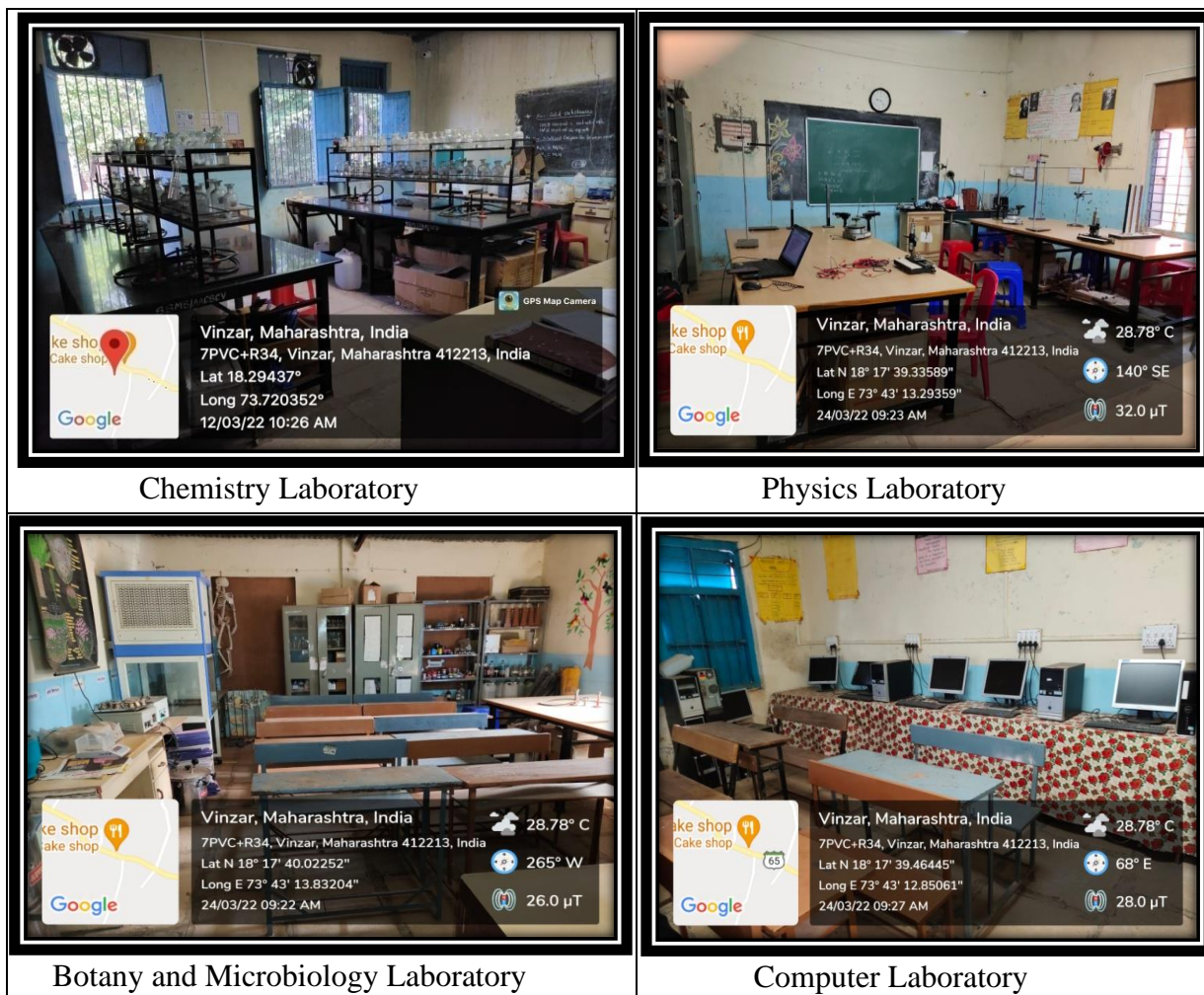


Indoor Games and Gym

7. Features and Initiative of College for Gender Sensitization

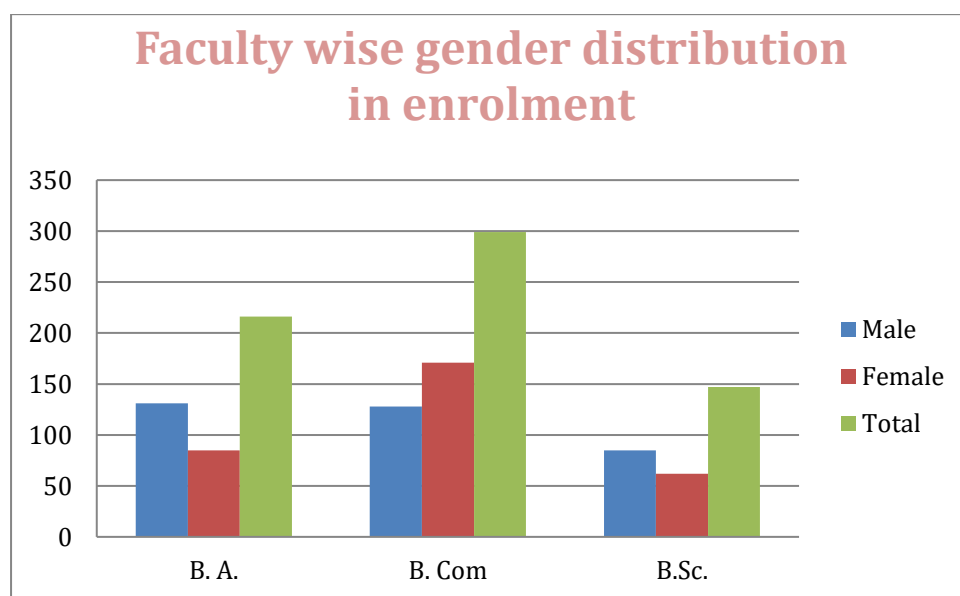
I. Gender Balance in Enrolment:

Students' strength at our college is increasing continuously. In the following table gender proportion of graduate students is given.

In the table no.1 faculty wise gender distribution in enrolment is given. Total enrolment at is 662. Out of them 344 (51.96%) are boys and 318 (48.03%) are girls. This difference is comparatively very less. This is due to in general good sex ration in velhe tehsil as per Census Report. We can still reduce this by educating the people on gender equality and make them aware with different facilities provided by the government and different social agencies for the females.

IX. Gender Difference in Teaching and Non-teaching staff:


Total senior teaching staff is 20. Out of them, 16 are male and 4 are female. Total non-teaching staff is 6 all of them are male. We will definitely reduce this gap through new recruitment once granted by the government.

8. Findings

- Different facilities are available for all students. These are helpful not only for educational development but also social, psychological, physical development of all students.
- Enrolment of girl students is little less than boys in total enrolment. It is necessary to increase the flow of girls in the higher education. As compare to previous year enrolment of girl students is increased.
- Many areas of the Velhe tehsil are too remote and hilly. There is no public transport facility to these areas. We provide completely free transport facility to girl students coming from the remote areas of the tehsil. This is really a good initiative of the college.
- More girls than the boys are active participant in many co-curricular activities. Boys needs to be motivated for the participation.
- Females are more successful than male according to above result.
- College has discipline committee, Anti Ragging committee, Anti Sexual Harassment Cell, Vishakha Committee to avoid the misbehavior and resolve the problems occurred with students and staff. We have approved Student Grievance Redressal policy.
- It is necessary to create awareness among students about their career and self –sufficiency.
- Males and females are actively participating in academics and Research. It is necessary to create awareness among students and staff about importance of research.
- The skill development programs are compulsory to students in CBCS pattern which are helpful for skill enhancement and career advancement.
- Female participation is greater than male in NSS activities. Social awareness is increasing in students by taking participation in NSS activities.
- Participation of girls is greater than boys in all the activities conducted by Science forum. It is necessary to motivate boys for science education.
- Female participation in co-curricular activities is greater than male. It is necessary for overall personality development.

9. Conclusion:

Gender audit of the college makes clear that the college has much strength and some limitations. College has taken some steps to overcome from the limitations. The findings show that college plays a key role to maintain harmony and discipline among students. It also takes steps to empower them socially, economically and psychologically. Many programs are conducted for both male and female. Some programs are conducted for only girl students to enhance their confidence and self-reliance. The college is contributing well towards gender justice and in creating a gender sensitive society. It is very important for creating harmony in the college as well as in the society.
